Essentials for Teaching and Learning at ICEM

1. Classes begin and end on time.

2. Timetable changes will be communicated a week before they go into effect.

3. Individual feedback on assessed student work provided within 15 working days.

4. Feedback on assessed student work is clear, legible and constructive.

- 5. Personal and academic tutors are made available to students by appointment.
- 6. Respectful treatment of students regardless of gender, nationality or religion.
- 7. Assistance in workplace readiness.

8. Appropriate qualifications, experience and industry knowledge.

- 9. A first-rate, stimulating academic environment.
- **10.** Professional and modern environment, facilities and IT infrastructure.

11. Exposure to teaching informed by current research, industry feedback and current teaching methodologies.

12. Access to online teaching and learning resources.

13. Appropriate accreditation by professional bodies for all courses, as well as industry-standard qualifications where applicable.

14. Observance of professional standards and ethics in relation to staff-student relationships.

15. Consistent approach in dealing with disciplinary matters, complaints, plagiarism, coursework and examination assessment, in line with applicable regulations.

16. Prior preparation and development of course material, assessments briefs and question papers in line with Module Information Packs and online dissemination of such where applicable.

Student Responsibilities

1. Complete assignments in a proper and timely manner.

2. Review and implement feedback received with regards to assessed work.

3. Be prepared to attend classes with at least a notebook and pen.

4. Attend classes fully prepared to engage in the learning process, armed with an eager attitude to learn and the appropriate tools to access learning.

5. Observe classroom timings.

6. Treat academic and support staff with respect, regardless of gender, nationality or religion.

7. Promote an environment conducive to learning by refraining from the use of electronic devices and the consumption of food or beverage in the classroom and maintaining a good discipline and ethical behaviour.
